Reflection on this week's Readings by

God's Truth

Revelations 1:5-8; John 18:33-37

Yes I am a King. I was born for this; I came into the world for this.

The Gospel today breaks from our usual Gospel of Mark, to read from John's Passion account. On Sundays we hear just a small section of the Gospel and so can miss its wider context. This is particularly true today. Throughout the entire narrative of John's Gospel, Jesus has spoken of his passion, his 'Hour', not as a death, but as a 'lifting up'.

"Now is the judgment of this world, now shall the ruler of this world be cast out; and I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to show by what death he was to die.' (John 12:31-32; also 3:14; 8:28)

This expression must be understood with two meanings. It refers to his being lifted up on a cross, but the word also means to be exalted, and, in John, the Cross is the great Hour of Jesus' exaltation. In the Hour he brings to completion the ministry he was sent to accomplish.

From Chapter 10 in John's Gospel, the Kingship theme comes into strong focus. In John 10 Jesus uses the image from the Old Testament of the Shepherd-Kings of Israel and speaks of himself as the Good Shepherd, one who will lay down his life for his flock (10:11). Then in Chapter 12, Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a donkey, just as King Solomon once did to claim his kingship (see 1 Kings 1:32-40). In John, the

crowds acclaim Jesus as 'King of Israel,' and wave the same types of palm branches that were used to greet Judas Maccabeus after his victory over the Greeks in 142 BCE. We read in the book of Maccabees, 'the Jews entered in [Jerusalem] with praise and palm branches, and with harps and cymbals...' (1 Macc 13:51). Even in his Passion the soldiers ironically give him a crown and a royal purple cloak to wear. And when Pilate presents Jesus to the crowd he says, 'Here is your King' (19:14), Jesus is still wearing the royal purple. So throughout John's passion Jesus is King.

Poor Pilate! He just doesn't get it. He is thinking of a kingdom with soldiers and armies, but Jesus speaks about truth. Armies can be conquered – even Rome's – but truth outlives Emperors. Even in oppressive regimes small sparks of truth refuse to be overcome by the darkness. Jesus is God's truth for us.

I speak now more personally as this is the final reflection for this liturgical year.

I have tried to bring to these words both biblical scholarship and reflections born of my own faith. I name this clearly, as sometimes I meet people who are afraid that scholarship and faith are enemies to each other. times, letting go the simplistic and sometimes erroneous notions we have carried. Tough! Painful! And liberating! God's truth is like that.

TREE: St Michael's St Vincent de Paul Conference has again organised the Christmas Gifting Tree to be in the Church from November 11 to December 09.



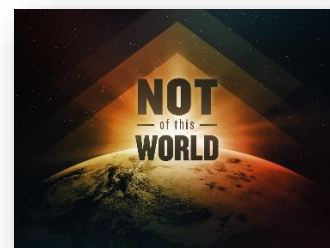

This does not apply to the elderly, the sick and those who care for them, or to priests celebrating a second or third Mass on a given day.

It is most strongly recommended that the faithful receive holy communion in the course of a eucharistic celebration. (CCL 918-919)

First Sunday of Advent Year C

First Reading: Jeremiah 33:14-16

Second Reading: Thessalonians 3:12-4:2

Gospel: Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

The start of a new liturgical year, beginning with the first Sunday of Advent, also marks the transition from one lectionary cycle (A, B or C) to the next.

These cycles are a result of the Second Vatican Council, which ordered a change in the Sunday readings at Mass so that Catholics would become more familiar with the text of the Bible. As a result, we now have a three-year cycle of readings built around readings from the three synoptic Gospels – Matthew, Mark and Luke. Year C uses the Gospel according to Luke.
