CHANGE OF SATURDAY AND SUNDAY EVENING MASS TIME (EFFECTIVE FROM 27/28 APRIL, 2019)

Last weekend (30/31 March) at the 6.00 pm Mass on Saturday and Sunday, I enquired of parishioners regarding a proposal to change our Saturday and Sunday evening Masses from 6.00 pm to 5.00 pm. The main reason being that it gets very dark quite early especially with the change of time in April. By the time we begin Mass at 6.00 pm it is already dark.

A lot of parishioners responded to the proposal verbally on their way out, some simply nodding when the proposal was announced. I did say silence means yes and many parishioners nodded. From the responses we have received at the office, and others who have spoken to me, the result is as follows:

- The majority of respondents (90%) are happy with 5.00 pm Mass on Saturdays and Sundays.
- Some (7%) don't mind 5.00 pm but suggest that 5.30 pm may be a good start for a change.
- A few others (3%) prefer 6.00 pm.

After the general enquiry and responses from the parishioners who attend the Masses concerned, I then passed on the proposal to the Parish Pastoral Council for their insight.

Before then I had enquired of the Liturgy Committee. Those who responded from the PPC and the Liturgy Team favour a time change for the Saturday and Sunday evening Masses, to either 5.00 pm or 5.30 pm. Starting with a 5.30 pm change was the preference of the majority.

Having put all the responses on the table of consideration and prayed over them, I'm happy to take the middle course and go with 5.30 pm for now.

Hence, with effect from the last weekend in April (weekend after Easter Sunday), that is the weekend of 27/28 April, the time for our Saturday and Sunday evening Masses will change from 6.00 pm to 5.30 pm.

This notification will go in the bulletin from this weekend till the weekend when the change is effected.

Thanks to everyone who responded by phone, by email and face-to-face. Your communication is greatly appreciated. God bless you.



Second Reading Phil 3:8-14

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians Because of Christ I look upon everything else as useless in order to gain him.

I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won. All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.

Gospel John 8:1-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Let the person without sin be the first to throw a stone.

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. At daybreak he appeared in the Temple again; and as all the people came to him, he sat down and began to teach them.

The scribes and Pharisees brought a woman along who had been caught committing adultery; and making her stand there in full view of everybody, they said to Jesus, 'Master, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery, and Moses has ordered us in the Law to condemn women like this to death by stoning. What have you to say?' They asked him this as a test, looking for something to use against him. But Jesus bent down and started writing on the ground with his finger. As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again. When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there. He looked up and said, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one, sir,' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus 'go away, and don't sin any more.'
