GOOD NIGHT MONS.

This weekend, Mons, the entire Diocese of Sale, and St Michael's Parish in particular, mourn your departure. We mourn, not sorrowfully, but with gratitude to God for a life well lived, trusting that you are now enjoying your choicest wine with the good Lord of abundance (Isa 25:6). You saw this coming, didn't you? On Sunday, 14 November, when I visited you, you did say that you did not sleep well the previous night, and retorted: "could this be death knocking?" Well, you laughed over it, trivialising the weight of your "joke." However, when you decided to show me where the Tabernacle key is "should something happen sooner than later," you, in a way, scared me. I did not take much notice of your worries because you've always bounced back. This time, you chose to not return, but to take the path to eternity; the eternal kingdom to which you devoted 70 years of your life in its propagation and preaching. I can visualise the Lord Jesus smiling, and with open arms, saying: "Well done good and faithful servant" (Matt 25:23).

You had wished to celebrate the Christmas vigil Mass with the residents at O'Mara House. Fr Peter and I were prepared to see this come to pass. It was pencilled in our diaries and in the events diary at O'Mara House. However, the Lord's ways of fulfilling our prayers and wishes are sometimes different from ours (Isa 55:8). So, on your last Saturday on earth, the 4th of December, the Lord sent his servant, Bishop Greg, to celebrate the Eucharist with you. Though you were in and out of sleep most of the liturgy of the Word, you came alive at the liturgy of the Eucharist. So, your last Mass, Mons, was at O'Mara House, with Bishop Greg present. It was a glorious moment. As fate would have it, on that glorious Friday morning, the 10th of December, you transitioned from time to eternity. Good on you, Mons.

Through every moment, you were quite sober, endured every pain, and carried out your ministry to the full (2 Tim 4:5). Your words after the Mass with the Bishop reflected the pattern of Paul: "I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time for my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept faith." (2 Tim 4:6-7). Of course, the crown of glory awaits you (2 Tim 4:8), to be presented to you by our Lord, accompanied by our Mother of Perpetual Help.

Well, it's been great ministering with you, though for a short while. Your dedication, devotion, and commitment to the priestly life and ministry in unprecedented. You have given us all an example of true commitment to the "call" and to the faith. A man of great strength, passion, and love of God and ministry, you are. You are indeed a priest forever, a priest like Melchizedek of old (Gen 14:18-20).

Though you are now gone, it is for a while for I shall see you again in the morning, in the city that "has no need of the sun or moon to shine on it..." (Rev 21:23). Good night, Mons... until we greet again in the morning.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

I am coming to do your will.

for sin; then I said, just as I was commanded in
the scroll of the book,

'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.
