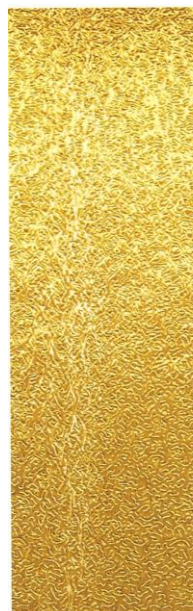

OCTOBER DEVOTION: The month of October is traditionally referred to as the month of Mary. It is especially dedicated to the recitation of the Holy Rosary primarily because October 7 is the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary. The practise of dedicating the entire month of October to the Holy Rosary developed towards the end of the 1800s. Pope Leo XIII (papacy: 1878-1903) promoted the increase of devotion to the blessed Mother by encouraging the constant use of the Rosary – a scriptural prayer and a powerful spiritual tool given to us by our mother Mary. During this month, join us for daily prayers and Rosary starting half an hour before each mass. Come let us celebrate our Mother.
