This weekend we are celebrating our social outreach program Mick's Kitchen. On Thursday night 11 volunteers prepared and served Spaghetti Bolognese and garlic bread made with rolls donated by Baker's Delight, followed by Apple Crumble and Custard to 50 guests. We also gave out 15 take away meals to local families along with an extra 10 meals to those in need. We gave out fresh bread, rolls and fruit buns donated by Banjo's Bakery. A fun time was had by all, with guests ranging in age from 9 months to 80 years old. The dining room was buzzing with conversation and laughter and I think our volunteers had as much fun as our guests.

Mick's Kitchen offers a safe space to connect with others, where you can enjoy a meal amongst friends at no cost and request further aid and assistance if required. Some people who originally joined us as guests are now volunteering their own time and giving back to the community through their service at Mick's Kitchen. We are part of the Latrobe Emergency Relief Network and are supported financially by government grants and donations from local businesses. Our primary running costs are food used to prepare weekly meals and increased food prices have really impacted our budget.

This weekend you will hear from some of our volunteers at each of our masses and are welcome to reach out to them and ask any questions you may have. We will also hold a leaving collection and ask you to give generously to support the ongoing running costs of Mick's Kitchen. We are also always on the look out for new volunteers or fundraising ideas so please reach out to the parish office if you have any suggestions or would like any further information.

'On the second day of ignite we were able to participate in adoration. Everyone found a spot in the room and sang their praises to God. We were all deep in prayer as we sang along with Emmanuel Worship. It was honestly one of the most freeing and healing experiences of my life. Even though there was around 700 other people in that room, it really felt as if it was a moment between God and myself. It felt as if God was right by my side and I was overwhelmed with this vulnerability in which I was able to just pour out my worries, fears, joys into his arms. And it didn't matter what stage of your spiritual journey you were at because God was in that room for everyone. In fact, one of my friends from Sydney, who prior to coming to Ignite had never been to church or believed in God, told me that during adoration, she had felt something, she felt his presence and she was starting to believe. I mean that in itself shows how powerful adoration was and how thankful I am to this parish and to everyone who helped us get to Ignite for the amazing experience we were blessed with.' First Reading Wisdom 6:12-16

A reading from the book of Wisdom

Wisdom is found by those who look for it.

Wisdom is bright, and does not grow dim.

By those who love her she is readily seen, and found by those who look for her. Quick to anticipate those who desire her, she makes herself known to them. Watch for her early and you will have no trouble; you will find her sitting at your gates.

Even to think about her is understanding fully grown; be on the alert for her and anxiety will quickly leave you.

She herself walks about looking for those who are worthy of her and graciously shows herself to them as they go, in every thought of theirs coming to meet them.

Second Reading 1 Thes 4:13-18

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

Those who died as Christians, God will bring to life with Jesus.

We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. So we shall stay with the Lord for ever. With such thoughts as these you should comfort one another.

Alleluia, alleluia! Be watchful and ready: you know not when the Son of Man is coming. Alleluia!

Gospel Mt 25:1-13

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew Look, the bridegroom comes. Go out to meet him.

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven will be like this: Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five of them were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone of to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.
